Links and Roots pages

Completing the next steps in your web page project

By now you should have your **home page** and your **resume page** complete with a well-laid-out resume in .pdf format.

You should also have blank (dummy) pages ready for your **Portfolio**, **CMS**, **Links**, and **Roots** pages. In other words, you should have all these Web pages uploaded to your Yahoo/geocities File Manager and all the Navigation Bar hyperlinks working successfully.

Using this handout, you are going to complete your **Links** and **Family Roots** pages.

The Links page

Load **FrontPage** and open the **links.htm** file that you have saved on your disk.

At the top of the page use a **larger font** and **center** the text and put the title: **Here are some of my favorite links**

Space down a couple of lines, then add hyperlinks to **at least 10** of your favorite web sites. For each website, write a brief description, then highlight the description, right click on it, and select hyperlink... from the pop up menu. Type (or paste) the exact hyperlink address in the dialog box and click OK.

The links you choose need not be educational, since you'll be creating a page of such in your CMS website later.

Once you have taken care of all 10 favorite links, save the page at this stage (**links.htm**).

Upload your new **links.htm** page to your Yahoo/geocities File Manager.

Next, in the **Task Bar**, click on the icon for your home page in yahoo, go to your **links.htm** page, and **Refresh** the pages (**ctrl-R**) to check it out.

Your Roots page

You can do whatever you want with this page. But you must have **at least 2 pictures** on the page. They don't have to be pictures of you or your family. That's up to you. But they should be pictures related to your family roots in some way. Each picture should have a **brief caption** explaining what the picture is all about.

If necessary, be sure to use **Handout #4, Working with Pictures on the Web**, to help you get your Roots page right first time!
